Highlights from Professor Dr. Sai Reddy's group (www.bsse.ethz.ch/lai)

- **The team is growing:** To date, Sai Reddy's team counts 5 Post-doctoral researcher, 2 PhD-students, 3 Master students, and 1 scientific staff member.
- The following post-doctoral researchers have received **honorable grants** to expand the research activities in Reddy's Lab: Dr. Ulrike Haessler (Marie Heim-Vögtlin Fellowship), Dr. Mark Pogson (ETH Post-doctoral Fellowships), and Dr. Tarik Khan (Whitaker Post-doctoral International Fellowship).
- **Leverage of the funding:** Sai Reddy has received additional funding from the Swiss National Science Foundation (project "Quantitative Molecular Analysis of Polyclonal B cell responses") and from the Swiss Initiative for Systems Biology SystemsX.ch (lead in the interdisciplinary project "AntibodyX")
- Sai Reddy established the **Master Class** "Biomolecular Engineering and Immunotechnology" for ETH students.
- Sai Reddy will speak about "Antibody Engineering for the Future" at the "Molecular Tri-Con Asia Bio-IT World Asia **Conference**" in Singapore May 28, 2013.
